They can be used at Farmers Markets on Saturdays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays (at the Fairgrounds), as well as the farms' own roadside stands.

### ***Fair Trade Coffee Store***

The Coffee Store will be open only once a month on the third Sunday of July, August, and September. The UUSC won't ship chocolate again until October, so we've stocked a summer supply of chocolate bars. Along with the ever-popular milk chocolate, UUs can choose from five flavors of antioxidant-rich dark chocolate: very dark chocolate and dark chocolate with almonds, espresso beans, cocoa nibs, or mint.

On July 15<sup>th</sup>, Aug. 19<sup>th</sup>, and Sept. 16<sup>th</sup>, the store will offer the customary variety of Fair Trade whole bean and drip grind coffees, both high-test and decaffeinated. Even during the summer, you'll want the hot cocoa mix for camping trips and the baking cocoa for a batch of brownies. Fair Trade organic tea selections include Irish Breakfast, Earl Grey, English Breakfast, Green Magic, Rooibos, and green teas.

### ***Community Offering for July 15<sup>th</sup>, 2007***

#### ***ACCHORD Music Mentorship Program***

AMP offers music lessons to in-risk youth in Lane County, Oregon. Music teachers give instruction in guitar, bass, keyboard etc. Participants are offered a free instrument following ten lessons, with the hope that they will develop an abiding appreciation for music and will find a constructive outlet for creativity and self-expression. Since early 2000, volunteer musicians have provided free guitar, bass and piano lessons to in-risk youth ages 11-17 at Looking Glass Station 7 Runaway Youth Shelter. To date, over 1000 lessons have been provided, and 18 youths have earned an instrument. The ACCHORD board oversees what goes on in the Music Mentorship program. The program director is Stu Sandine.

### ***Are You Over 70?***

If you are an IRA owner over age 70 you can make tax-free distributions from traditional and Roth IRAs (of up to \$100,000) to public charities, like UUCE. Such donations must be made directly from your IRA to the charity you select, and the distributions are not reported as income on your taxes. This is noteworthy now, because this is allowed under the Pension Protection Act of 2006, and this provision ends on December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2007!

If you are over 70 1/2, like us, you may be required to withdraw every year a minimum percentage (called minimum distributions) from some of your IRAs. We are going to have our required distributions made directly to UUCE. Rather than have them go into the general fund, which would also be a good idea, we are going to put them into a new fund, called the "Building Fund: Our New Home" which will be folded into a capital campaign as soon as one is formally launched.

- Plans are underway to obtain the external bulletin board approved by Coordinating Council and Board. It will be placed by the front entrance to the church. Also, we'll tackle the bathroom hall changes approved by the Coordinating Council.

  - The church sign will be updated with the new minister's name on it.
  - Bike use is up, so we are planning to obtain another bike rack. Some dangerous round logs in the parking lot will be secured or removed.

### ***UUCE's First Church Building***

Arthur Hayes Sargent, our second minister, led the drive for the Community Liberal Church of Eugene (Unitarian) to build a permanent home. In May 1910, it was decided to buy a lot at the corner of 11<sup>th</sup> and Ferry for the munificent sum of \$2650 (most of it loaned by the AUA in Boston). On Jan. 13, 1912, an entry in the minutes of the trustees meeting states that "plans for a new church were discussed and specifications prepared by Mr. (Y.D.) Hensill (a local architect) were shown." In the early part of 1912, the church was built and on June 10, 1912, the first meeting in the church was held. However the church was not dedicated until September, on Sunday afternoon, Sept. 29<sup>th</sup>, 1912. Rev. William Eliot Jr., minister of Portland's Unitarian Church of Our Father gave the sermon. Our very own Rev. Stephen Peebles gave the dedicatory prayer. Also taking part were the Rev. A.M. Spangler of the Congregationalist Church of Eugene and a Rev. E.A. McAllister. At first only the church auditorium, fireplace room and a tiny kitchen were built. In 1915, the real kitchen and dining room were added and finally furnished by the funding provided by the hard-working women of the Alliance. —Bob Taylor, Archive Committee
