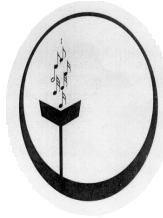

### *UUCE Endowment Fund Update*

**Jan. 1 through June 30, 2007**

We received gifts of \$1,861.02, the funds in our Charles Schwab account earned interest and dividends of \$930.82, and we received \$77.91 from the Campbell Fund. There was a positive market change of \$1,776.23 and we incurred a \$25.00 bank charge.

After consultation with the UUCE Board, the Endowment Fund trustees decided to transfer the funds to the General Investment Fund of the UUA (UUA GIF). In doing so, we sold securities worth \$46,000.00 and this cash amount was transferred into UUA GIF on June 21<sup>st</sup>. Remaining funds will be transferred as they mature.

The beginning balance in our Schwab account on Jan. 1<sup>st</sup> was \$69,606.86. The ending balance in UUA GIF was \$46,000, the Schwab account had \$28,227.84, and their total was \$74,227.84.

The objective of the Endowment Fund is to provide for the long-term health and survival of our congregation. Its assets are held in a balanced, diversified portfolio of conservative investment accounts at Charles Schwab and the Unitarian Universalist Association General Investment Fund. Our goals are capital preservation and income.

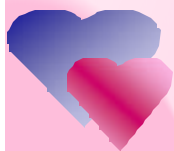
